**March 2023 TUGON NG MASA (TNM) Survey:  
Press Release on Performance and Trustworthiness Ratings  
of the Top Philippine Government Officials  
18 April 2023**

We are delighted to share some of the key findings from the **Tugon ng Masa (TNM)** nationwide survey, an independent and non-partisan poll conducted regularly by OCTA RESEARCH. The survey results reported here are non-commissioned and focus on **the Performance and Trustworthiness Ratings of the Top Philippine Government Officials**. These survey results are released as a public service by OCTA RESEARCH.

The survey fieldwork was conducted from **March 24 to 28, 2023**, using face-to-face interviews. One thousand two hundred (1200) male and female probability respondents aged 18 years and above were interviewed for the study. This survey has a **±3%** margin of error at a 95% confidence level. Subnational estimates for the geographic areas covered in the survey have the following margins of error at a 95% confidence level: **±6%** for Metro Manila, Balance Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

***The President and the Vice-President recorded big majority approval and trust ratings in March 2023, while the other top officials experienced significant movements in their respective ratings***

Four out of the five top government officials recorded bare to big majority approval ratings in the March 2023 OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide survey. Bare to big majority approval ratings are recorded by the President (80%), the Vice-President (84%), Senate President Juan Miguel F. Zubiri (53%), and House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez (59%) in the March 2023 nationwide survey. Only Chief Justice Alexander Gesmundo, registered a performance rating of less than the majority at 41%. *(Please refer to Table 1.)*

In terms of their trustworthiness, *most of the country's adult population trusts only the President and the Vice-President*. The President and the Vice-President received big majority of trust scores from the Filipino public (83% and 87%, respectively) in the March 2023 OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide survey. *(Please refer to Table 3.)*

It must be noted that, that the general public opinion regarding the performance and trustworthiness of the President and the Vice-President remains **essentially constant** between the OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide surveys conducted last October 2022 and its latest survey in March 2023. *(Please refer to Tables 2 & 4.)*

Other top officials also experienced significant movements in their respective ratings. A notable change based on a comparison between the OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide surveys conducted last October 2022 and this survey is the **significant rise** in the performance and trustworthiness of House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez and Chief Justice Alexander Gesmundo (15% and 11% for performance, and 17% and 15% for trustworthiness respectively). *(Please refer to Tables 2 & 4)* Meanwhile, the performance and trustworthiness of Senate President Juan Miguel F. Zubiri remained constant.

## Highlights on Performance Ratings of Top Philippine Government Officials

Bare to a significant majority of adult Filipinos are satisfied with the performance of four (4) of the five top national government officials. These high performances are recorded by the President (80%), the Vice-President (84%), Senate President Juan Miguel F. Zubiri (53%), and House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez (59%) in the March 2023 OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide survey.

For Supreme Court Chief Justice Alexander G. Gesmundo, there is a significant percentage of adult Filipinos who are uncertain (45%) than those who approve (41%) of his quarterly performance. The levels of disapproval for the top government officials' performance range from 4% for the Vice-President to 14% for the Supreme Court Chief Justice.

The dissatisfaction of adult Filipinos is lowest with the President (6%) and Vice President (4%) and highest with Supreme Court Chief Justice (14%) among the top five government officials. *(Please refer to Table 1.)*

Across major geographical areas, the President and Vice President's overall performance are highly approved by most adult Filipinos (73% to 89% and 76% to 92%, respectively). The President's highest satisfaction rating is in Visayas (89%), while the Vice President's highest satisfaction rating is in Mindanao (92%). For both the President and Vice President, NCR is the area with their lowest satisfaction rating (73% and 76%, respectively).

Similarly, the President and Vice President's overall performance are approved by most adult Filipinos in terms of socio-economic classes (78% to 84% and 84% to 87%, respectively). Among the socio-economic classes, the President has the highest satisfaction rating of adult Filipinos in Class ABC (84%) and the lowest in Class E (78%). The percentages of the approval of adult Filipinos on the Vice President are consistent among the socio-economic classes. *(Please refer to Table 2.)*

In the case of Senate President Zubiri, he has his majority of approval figures in NCR (55%), Visayas (71%), Mindanao (72%), Class D (53%), and Class E (67%). More than half of the adult Filipinos in Balance Luzon (52%) and in Class ABC (52%) are indecisive about the performance of Senate President Zubiri.

Similar to that of Senate President Zubiri, the satisfaction figures of House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez are highly approved in NCR (61%), Visayas (83%), Mindanao (70%), Class D (60%) and Class E (67%). Also, a significant number of adult Filipinos in Balance Luzon (46%) and in Class ABC (51%) are indecisive about the performance of House Speaker Romualdez.

There are about the same satisfaction and uncertainty figures that surround Supreme Court Chief Justice Alexander G. Gesmundo in NCR (43% and 47%), Visayas (both 41%), and Class D (42% and 44%) Class E (40 and 49%). In Balanced Luzon (51%), a significant number of adult Filipinos are indecisive about the performance of Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo. Conversely, Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo's approval of his performance is highest in Mindanao (52%). *(Please refer to Table 2.)*

## Highlights on Comparative Performance Ratings of Top Philippine Government Officials

The approval rating of adult Filipinos regarding the performance of the President and the Vice-President remains essentially constant between October 2022 and March 2023. In contrast, Senate President Zubiri, House Speaker Romualdez, and Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo have significant changes in their respective performance ratings during this period. *(Please refer to Table 2.)*

The most notable increase in satisfaction towards the President and Vice President's performance lies in Class ABC (+17 and +12 percentage points, respectively).

Appreciation for Senate President Zubiri's performance declined in Balanced Luzon (-8 percentage points) and Class ABC (-12 percentage points). The indecisions of adult Filipinos towards the Senate President's performance have increased in Balanced Luzon (+14 percentage points) and Classes ABC and D (+5 percentage points). In contrast, Senate President Zubiri's performance rating increased in Visayas (+8 percentage points), Mindanao (+10 percentage points), and Class E (+14 percentage points). *(Please refer to Table 2.)*

The approval for House Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez's performance has tremendously increased in all geographical areas and socio-economic classes. The highest increase among the geographical areas is Visayas (+36 percentage points), with the lowest rise in Balanced Luzon (+4 percentage points). The highest growth among the socio-economic classes is in Class E (+27 percentage points), while the lowest increase is in Class ABC (+10 percentage points). These increases resulted from the decline in the disapproval and indecisiveness of adult Filipinos towards House Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez's performance. The most notable are the decreases in the undecided figures in Visayas (-32 percentage points) and the undecided and dissatisfaction figures for Class E (-17 and -10 percentage points, respectively). *(Please refer to Table 2.)*

Like House Speaker Romualdez, appreciation for Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo's performance has tremendously increased in all geographical areas and socio-economic classes. Despite these increases, all but one, Mindanao (52%), did not exceed half of the adult Filipinos for each category during the OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide survey conducted in March 2023. The highest increase among the geographical areas is Visayas (+16 percentage points), with the lowest rise in Balanced Luzon (+8 percentage points). The highest growth among the socio-economic classes is Class E (+19 percentage points), with the lowest increase in Class ABC (+9 percentage points). Indecisiveness towards Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo's performance primarily decreased, with NCR (-12 percentage points) being the highest among all major areas and Class E (-17 percentage points) among all socio-economic classes. *(Please refer to Table 2.)*

## Highlights on Trust Ratings of Top Philippine Government Officials

The majority of adult Filipinos trust four (4) of the five top national government officials. These high figures of trustworthiness are recorded by the President (83%), the Vice-President (87%), Senate President Juan Miguel F. Zubiri (50%), and House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez (55%) in the March 2023 OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide survey.

For Supreme Court Chief Justice Alexander G. Gesmundo, a significant percentage of adult Filipinos are uncertain of his trustworthiness (47%) than those who trust (39%). Levels of disapproval for these officials' performance range from 3% for the Vice-President to 14% for the Supreme Court Chief Justice.

The distrust of adult Filipinos is lowest in the President (4%) and Vice President (3%) and highest in Supreme Court Chief Justice (14%) among the top five government officials. *(Please refer to Table 3.)*

Across major geographical areas, most adult Filipinos highly trust the President and Vice President (76% to 91% and 78% to 96%, respectively). The President's highest trust rating is in Visayas (91%), while the Vice President's highest trust rating is in Mindanao (96%). For both the President and Vice President, NCR is the area with their lowest trust rating (76% and 78%, respectively). The ranking is similar to the performance ratings of the President and Vice President.

In terms of trust rating among the socio-economic classes, the President and Vice President's overall figures show that most adult Filipinos highly trust them (82% to 84% and 86% to 88%, respectively). *(Please refer to Table 4.)*

In the case of Senate President Zubiri, he has his majority of trustworthiness figures in Visayas (63%), Mindanao (77%), and Class E (65%). A significant number of adult Filipinos in Balance Luzon (56%) and Class D (45%) are indecisive about the trustworthiness of Senate President Zubiri. *(Please refer to Table 4.)*

The trustworthiness figures of House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez are high in NCR (56%), Visayas (77%), Mindanao (66%), Class D (55%), and Class E (64%). Also, a significant number of adult Filipinos in Balance Luzon (47%) and in Class ABC (46%) are indecisive about the trustworthiness of House Speaker Romualdez. *(Please refer to Table 4.)*

There are more adult Filipinos that are indecisive about Supreme Court Chief Justice Alexander G. Gesmundo's trustworthiness than those who are confident of his trustworthiness in NCR (55% versus 34%), Balanced Luzon (49% versus 38%), Visayas (42% versus 38%), Class D (47% versus 39%) and Class E (51% versus 35%). The exceptions are in Mindanao (42% versus 47%) and Class ABC (39% versus 43%). In NCR (55%) and Class E (51%), many adult

### Highlights on Comparative Trust Ratings of Top Philippine Government Officials

The trust rating of adult Filipinos towards the President, the Vice-President, and Senate President Zubiri remains essentially constant on a national level between October 2022 and March 2023. In contrast, House Speaker Romualdez and Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo have significant changes in their respective performance ratings during this period.  
(Please refer to Table 4.)

The highest increase in trust towards the President in Class ABC (+6 percentage points), and his highest decrease in trust is in Mindanao (-9 percentage points). Meanwhile, the Vice President had the highest increase in trust in Visayas (+5 percentage points) and the highest decrease in trust in NCR (-5 percentage points).

Senate President Zubiri had the highest increase in trust in Mindanao and Class E (+11 and +10 percentage points, respectively) and the highest decrease in trust in Balanced Luzon (-8 percentage points). The increases in Mindanao and Class E were influenced by the decline in the indecisiveness towards Senate President Zubiri's trustworthiness on each of those categories (-10 percentage points for both). Indecisions for trusting Senate President Zubiri



increased in Balanced Luzon (+11 percentage points) and Class D (+9 percentage points). Meanwhile, distrust for Senate President Zubiri increased in Class ABC (+7 percentage points). This result was influenced by the decrease in indecision for trust by adult Filipinos in Class ABC (-8 percentage points). *(Please refer to Table 4.)*

The trustworthiness figures on the House Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez have tremendously increased in all geographical areas and socio-economic classes. The highest increase among the geographical areas is Visayas (+40 percentage points), with the lowest rise in Balanced Luzon and Mindanao (+10 and +11 percentage points, respectively). The highest growth among the socio-economic classes is Class E (+24 percentage points), followed behind is Class D (+17 percentage points), and the lowest increase is Class ABC (+8 percentage points). These increases resulted from the decline in the indecisiveness of adult Filipinos towards House Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez's trustworthiness. The most notable are the decreases in Visayas (-37 percentage points) and Class E (-23 percentage points). *(Please refer to Table 4.)*

Like House Speaker Romualdez, the trust for Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo has tremendously increased in all geographical areas and socio-economic classes. Despite these increases, all did not exceed half of the adult Filipinos for each category during the OCTA Research Tugon ng Masa (TNM) nationwide survey conducted on March 2023. The highest increase among the geographical areas is Balanced Luzon (+23 percentage points), with the lowest rise in Mindanao (+4 percentage points). The highest growth among the socio-economic classes is Class E (+18 percentage points), followed behind is Class D (+15 percentage points), and the lowest increase is Class ABC (+9 percentage points). The decrease in indecisiveness towards Supreme Court Chief Justice Gesmundo's trustworthiness contributed to the rise in trust, which can be seen most notably in Balanced Luzon and Class E (-23 and -22 percentage points). *(Please refer to Table 4.)*
